Inauguration of PrivatAir's New C3 Terminal

The Management of Geneva International Airport and PrivatAir are pleased to inaugurate, this Monday March 4, the new C3 Terminal which has been designed to accommodate the business aviation services offered by PrivatAir and its neighbours TAG Aviation and Jet Aviation.

The terminal, which has a total floor area of 4'600 m² on three levels plus an underground car park, is a joint project by the owners, GenevaInternationalAirport and PrivatAir. The design is by architects Aris Serbetis and Dominique Grenier. Construction works were carried out by general contractor Steiner SA, the civil engineer was Société Générale pour l'Industrie and the work was supervised by the New Building Service of Geneva Airport's Technical Division. Work commenced in December 2000, the total cost of the project being CHF 12.5 million. PrivatAir's facilities were opened on February 19.

The new C3 Terminal offers top quality services to the above companies, as well as to their customers. Both Swiss and French Customs and Immigration services are present in the terminal and security checks are carried out by GenevaAirport's Passenger Division.

The inauguration of the C3 Terminal illustrates the commitment of GenevaInternationalAirport and its business aviation partners to offer a VIP service that truly reflects Geneva's reputation as the "SummitAirport" of Europe. Indeed, the development of business aviation constitutes an essential element of GenevaInternationalAirport's vocation to serve the region's economic and diplomatic community.
